How to become a midwife



WHAT IS A MIDWIFE?

A midwife is a healthcare professional who provides support and care to women during pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum. They help women with various aspects of childbirth, including monitoring their health, providing education and counselling, assisting with labour and delivery, and ensuring the health of the mother and baby after birth. Midwives also provide emotional and practical support to new mothers and their families.

WHY MIDWIVES ARE AMAZING

Midwives are amazing because they provide compassionate and comprehensive care to women throughout pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum. They play a crucial role in ensuring the health and well-being of both mother and baby, and often act as advocates for their patients. Midwives bring a unique combination of medical expertise and emotional support, making them highly valued and respected members of the healthcare team.

WHAT YOU NEED TO CONSIDER

Midwives face various risks in their job, including exposure to infectious diseases and psychological trauma. They work long hours, often on-call, and face the risk of burnout and compassion fatigue. Midwives may also face difficult situations, such as foetal distress or maternal haemorrhage, which require quick thinking and decision-making under pressure.

STUDYING MIDWIFERY

To be eligible to study midwifery at university applicants will need to:

- Meet academic and English language requirements
- Meet inherent requirements

To be eligible to participate in clinical placements, students will need to obtain:

- Police Record Check
- Working with Children Check
- First Aid/CPR
- Immunisation and testing for blood born viruses.

Students will be required to pay for their own transport and accommodation when travelling to participate in clinical placements.

What ATAR will I need?

When it comes to the ATAR, there are three ways you can gain direct entry into an undergraduate entry midwifery degree in Victoria – achieving a selection rank above the lowest rank for the relevant intake, achieving above the guaranteed ATAR, or receiving a place in the ACU Guarantee program.

SELECTION RANK

Universities use the 'selection rank' when assessing course applications.

The selection rank is your ATAR plus any adjustment factors taken into consideration by the university (e.g., equity and academic adjustments).

Adjustment factors are added to your combined study scores (VCE aggregate) and your ATAR is reranked.

Your selection rank will be different for each course at each university as each institute uses their own adjustment programs.

You won't know what your selection rank is, but you'll need to achieve a rank above the 'lowest selection rank' for the relevant intake year.

NO ATAR

Australian Catholic University offers the Bachelor of Midwifery at the Melbourne campus.

They have an early entry program called 'ACU Guarantee'. Successful applicants can receive a conditional 'ATAR free' offer for the course through this program.

The University calculates a selection rank using your Year 11 grades. The selection rank can be boosted through providing up to three personal statements.

The conditions of the early offer program are successfully completing Year 12, achieving course prerequisites, and ordering your VTAC preferences correctly.

Applications open 22 July and close 16 September 2024.

GRADUATE ENTRY

Graduate Diploma of Midwifery

La Trobe also offers an accredited Midwifery qualification at the graduate level. Below is the entry pathway:

Step 1

Complete the Bachelor of Nursing and register as a Division 1 nurse with AHPRA.

Step 2

Complete at least 1 year of postregistration acute medical/surgical nursing or have industry experience.

Step 3

Secure a clinical place at an approved clinical midwifery agency and complete the 1-year Graduate Diploma of Midwifery.

Prerequisites - Units 3 and 4 Course Campus Minimum study score of 30 in English (EAL) or 25 Bachelor of Nursing / Bachelor Melbourne of Midwifery in any other English. Bendigo Bachelor of Nursing / Bachelor Minimum study score of 30 in English (EAL) or 25 Bendigo of Midwifery (Regional Entry) in any other English. Must reside in an RA2 - RA5 area. Bachelor of Nursing / Bachelor Minimum study score of 30 in English (EAL) or 25 Bendigo of Midwifery (First Nations in any other English. Applicants may be required

to attend an interview.

PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION

The Bachelor of Nursing/Bachelor of Midwifery is undergoing accreditation by the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council (ANMAC). Graduates of the Bachelor of Nursing/Bachelor of Midwifery may be eligible to apply for registration with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA). The Graduate Diploma in Midwifery is accredited by the ANMAC.

UNDERGRADUATE ENTRY

FIRST NATIONS AUSTRALIAN ENTRY

This is an alternative entry program into the Bachelor of Nursing / Bachelor of Midwifery for applicants who are First Nations Australian. Choose the 'First Nation Australian' tagged course via VTAC.

HOW TO APPLY

Apply via the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre. Applications will open for Year 12 students on 29 July 2024.

PATHWAY

The following is an example of a pathway into the Bachelor of Nursing/Bachelor of Midwifery.

STEP 1: Bachelor of Nursing

Complete the first year of the Bachelor of Nursing (Pre-Registration) at La Trobe University.

STEP 2: Bachelor of Nursing / Bachelor of Midwifery

Apply for the combined degree and use your Weighted Average Mark (WAM) for entry into first year. You may receive some advanced standing.

SELECTION RANK ADJUSTMENTS

If eligible, La Trobe will add adjustment factors to your VCE aggregate to recalculate your ATAR and boost your selection rank for entry into their courses. For example, your ATAR might be 60 but after adjustment factors are added, your selection rank might be 72.5. Adjustment factors are calculated from initiatives such as the following. Note - if you're eligible for multiple initiatives, the maximum aggregate adjustments you can receive is 20.

Subject adjustments

Applicants can receive a maximum of 12 adjustments for high achievement in eligible Units 3 and 4 subjects. In the 2024 intake, the eligible subjects were: Health And Human Development, any LOTE, any Mathematics, Physical Education or any Science. Adjustments for the 2025 intake will be advertised via VTAC from 29 July 2024.

Priority Access Program

A maximum of 15 adjustment factors are awarded to applicants who fall within any of the following categories: priority school (5), priority campus (5), regional school (5).

Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS)

Applicants can receive a maximum of 20 adjustment factors for disadvantage that has impacted their education. Applicants can apply for this scheme via the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) between 29 July – 11 October 2024 after creating their VTAC account and adding course preferences.

Elite Athlete ATAR Adjustment

Applicants can receive up to 5 aggregate adjustments. Click here for information.

Rural and Regional Student Access Scheme (RRSAS)

Students residing in an area classified as RA2 or higher are eligible for the following adjustments:

Regional students applying to courses at the Melbourne (Bundoora) campus will receive 5 aggregate points. Regional students applying to courses at Bendigo, Albury Wodonga, Mildura and Shepparton will receive 10 aggregate points.

Complete the 1.5-year online Graduate Diploma of Midwifery in conjunction with paid employment in a collaborating hospital.

SELECTION RANK ADJUSTMENTS

Subject Bonus Points

Applicants can receive up to 12 adjustments for high achievement in eligible Units 3 and 4 subjects. In the 2024 intake, the eligible subjects were Biology, any English, Health And Human Development or any Mathematics. Eligible subjects for the 2025 intake will be advertised via VTAC from 29 July 2024.

Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS)

Applicants can receive adjustment points for short or long-term disadvantage. Applicants can apply for this scheme via the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) between 29 July – 11 October 2024 after creating their VTAC account and adding course preferences. Examples of adjustments and the maximum aggregate include:

- Indigenous applicants: 15
- Regional or remote student: 10
- Under-represented school: 10
- Non-English speaking background: 5

Category 2: Financial Disadvantage

- 2019/2020 bushfires: up to 10 adjustments

Under-represented Discipline

Men applying for the Bachelor of Nursing / Bachelor of Midwifery are eligible to receive additional consideration.

EARLY ENTRY

The Bachelor of Nursing/Bachelor of Midwifery isn't eligible for early entry at Deakin

EXAMPLE

Meet Jade

Jade wants to maximise her chances of getting an offer for the Bachelor of Nursing/Bachelor of Midwifery at Deakin so she does the following:

Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC)

She formally applies for the course via VTAC and places the Diploma of Nursing at Box Hill TAFE as a backup course in her preferences. Applications open 29 July 2024. She completes the Nursing and Midwifery English Language form in her VTAC account.

Special Education Access Scheme (SEAS)

She completes an application for SEAS via VTAC so she is eligible for equity adjustments towards her selection rank. She is eligible for Category 1 (Personal Information and Location) and Category 4 (Difficult Circumstances). She uploads a supporting statement from a teacher at her school as evidence for Category 4.

Elite Athlete and Performers Adjustment Scheme

She applies for this scheme and uploads evidence of her elite athlete status. Her application is successful and she is eligible for 5 adjustment points towards her selection rank.

Outcome

Jade received a competitive ATAR and met the entry requirements for the Bachelor of Nursing / Bachelor of Midwifery. Her selection rank was higher than the lowest rank for the December round and she received a formal offer for the course via VTAC. FEDERATION UNIVERSITY

Step 2

Complete at least one year's recent postregistration acute medical/surgical nursing experience.

Step 3

Apply for the 1-year Graduate Diploma of Midwifery and submit the 'essential requirements' form. Meet course and English language requirements.

Step 4

Complete the Graduate Diploma of Midwifery and gain clinical experience through the 'Employment Model' or the 'Supernumerary Model'. Click here for information.

Subject adjustments

Applicants can receive up to 5 adjustments for high achievement in eligible Units 3 and 4 subjects. In the 2024 intake, the eligible subjects were: Biology, Chemistry, Health And Human Development, any Mathematics and Physics. Eligible subjects for the 2025 intake will be advertised via VTAC from 29 July 2024.

Access and Equity Scheme

Applicants can apply for this scheme via the Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS). Applicants apply for SEAS after creating their VTAC account and adding course preferences. Across the four SEAS categories Federation University will award a maximum adjustment of 15 aggregate points per applicant. Applications will open between 29 July – 11 October 2024.

The following are examples of adjustments and the maximum aggregate per category:

GUARANTEED ATAR

The guaranteed ATAR for the Bachelor of Nursing / Bachelor of Midwifery at Federation University is 75.

EARLY ENTRY PROGRAM

Applications for the Early Offer program are now open and will close on 1 December.
Selection is based on an online application.
Successful applicants will receive a conditional offer to the course.

To receive a formal offer, applicants will need to complete Year 12, meet course prerequisites, achieve an ATAR of at least 75, and preference the course in their VTAC account correctly.

Meeting the minimum admission criteria does not guarantee entry into this course. An equivalent ATAR must be satisfied and will be based on your past academic performance in Higher Education studies, VET studies and in some instances, your past Year 12 studies if still relevant.

STEP 3: Bachelor of Nursing

Apply for the Bachelor of Midwifery *I* Bachelor of Nursing. You must meet the English language prerequisite.

SELECTION RANK ADJUSTMENTS

BACHELOR OF MIDWIFERY

This midwifery course will teach you how to:

- manage normal pregnancy and childbirth
- provide effective postnatal, maternal and newborn care to women and their newborn infant
- provide safe and reliable care that meets the individual psychological, emotional, physical, social and spiritual needs of women.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

Bachelor of Midwifery students will do midwifery clinical practice throughout the course in hospital and community settings. The students will also engage with a minimum of ten women to follow their pregnancy, labour, birth and postnatal care journey called their Continuity of Care Experiences (CCE).

This experience involves the student recruiting the woman in early pregnancy and attending appointments throughout. If possible, the student attends the labour and birth and follows the woman after discharge home up to six weeks following birth.

EARLY ENTRY PROGRAM

The ACU Guarantee is a program that uses an alternative selection rank for entry into most courses.

A selection rank is calculated from your Year 11 academic results and can be boosted by several factors such as completing up to three personal statements and living in a rural/regional area.

Successful applicants will receive a conditional offer for the Bachelor of Midwifery and will no longer require an ATAR or study scores for entry into the course.

To receive a formal offer, applicants will need to complete Year 12, meet course prerequisites, and preference the course in their VTAC account correctly.

Applications for the program will open on 22 July and close on 16 September 2024.

Applicants apply for the scheme by ticking 'yes' to SEAS Category 1 – Personal Information and Location. Applications will open on 29 July 2024 via VTAC.

INDIGENOUS ACCESS PROGRAMS

The Monash Indigenous Access Program (MIAP) is a scholarship-funded bridging program designed to prepare students for entry into a variety of undergraduate degrees at Monash University.
